Any Post issuing such unauthorized cards, or conducting club operations open to the general public, endangers its standing with the Internal Revenue Service as a non-profit organization. Officers signing outlaw cards admitting non-members to VFW premises are subject to disciplinary action. National and Department officers cannot defend practices that conflict with VFW Bylaws or procedures.

#### 6. AUDITS:

Attention of Post Commanders is directed to Section 218(a)(11) of the National Manual of Procedure, Officers: Duties and Obligations. Trustees' Report of Audit must be prepared in detail within thirty (30) days from the end of each quarter, one of which ended March 31 and is **NOW PAST DUE**.

#### 7. DELEGATE FEES:

In accordance with the National By-Laws Section 222 (C), each Post will pay in accordance with Department By-Laws a delegate registration fee for each delegate to which the Post shall be entitled.

Therefore, you must submit your delegates list to the Department in accordance with Section 222 of the Manual of Procedure (B) along with a check in the amount of \$3.00 for every delegate your Post is entitled to as of membership status of March 31. All delegate list and monies should have been sent to Department Headquarters by **May 27th**. Failure to do so will put your Post in arrears to the Department and Post will have no voting strength at the State Convention. **The Delegate sheet was the front page of the April General Orders.** 

#### 8. DUTIES OF TRUSTEES:

Attention of Post Commanders is directed to section 218 of the Manual of Procedure, "Duty of Trustees." Trustees Report of Audit must be completed in detail at the close of each quarter. Commanders are reminded that accurate and complete records shall be kept by all persons handling Post funds, including the Club Manager and Bingo Chairman. These records shall be audited by Post Trustees in the same manner as Post Quartermaster and Adjutant records.

#### 9. DOORDASH:

#### 10. ELIGIBILITY TO VOTE AT STATE CONVENTION:

Per Section 213 of the National Bylaws, Posts that have not submitted a properly completed Post Election Report by June 1 are in arrears and shall be deprived of all representation in District, Department and National Conventions. Such representation shall be restored promptly upon proper adjustments of such deficiencies. Posts that have registered delegates for the Department and National Conventions will not receive credentials until the Post has satisfied their arrearage.

#### 11. E-MAIL ACCOUNT ACCESS:

All email accounts were reset so the new Officers could take control of their emails as of **June 15<sup>th</sup>**. This will be the primary means of sending correspondence from State Headquarters to Post and District Officers.

You will receive all General Orders, special notices and any other documentation that you need via email. This will help cut down on postal expenses and speed up the response time for you receiving the information.

#### 15. IRS FORM 8822-B:

IRS Form 8822-B, it is now a requirement by the IRS that all Posts submit this form. This form must be submitted anytime the Post Quartermaster changes and/or the Post address changes. This is effective January 1, 2014.

#### 16. JLC REPORT:

The Joint Leadership Council of Veterans Service Organizations met in Richmond on May 12. The body reviewed the results of the JLC initiatives presented in the past legislative session. Of note, the initiative to protect color guard firing parties from prosecution was signed into law by the Governor. Also, the proposed tax relief for spouses of military members who died in the line of duty was passed with modifications that allows jurisdictional option on whether to implement the tax relief. The Military Officers Association of America (MOAA), that introduced the legislative agenda, will be drafting a proposal to amend the Constitution of Virginia to make the tax relief mandatory. As the VFW JLC representative I will propose at our State Convention that we partner with MOAA in support of this initiative.

VDVS Commissioner Danial Gade addressed the body with an update of VDVS operations and the status of programs. VDVS is also willing to present service officer training as part of their outreach program, an opportunity I am investing for our Winter Council meeting in January 2023.

Several proposals are being considered for the 2023 legislative initiatives including: increased funding for suicide prevention, waiver of spousal internment fees in state cemeteries, tax relief for veterans O5 and below and the constitutional amendment mentioned previously. Veteran tax relief figures prominently with Commissioner Gade's saying to veterans that it is important that they remain living in Virginia; "Stay/Work/Thrive".

I am pleased to announce that Post 9808 Quartermaster Joanne Smith has accepted the position of VFW JLC alternate. I look forward to working with Joanne to make our JLC involvement notable.

#### 22. POSTS IN ARREARS FOR FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS:

Attention is directed to Section 213 of the National Bylaws concerning any Post in arrears for any financial obligations to County Council (if applicable), District, Department and National for fees, dues, poppy money, supply money, failing to have the office of Quartermaster properly bonded in accordance with Section 703, failing to ensure that the Post is properly insured in accordance with Section 709, failing to submit properly completed quarterly Post Trustees Report of Audit, Post Election Report for the ensuing year, or other obligations, shall be deprived of all representation in County Council and District meetings; County Council, District, Department and National Conventions. Such representation shall be restored promptly upon proper adjustment of such deficiencies.

#### 23. PROOF OF ELIGIBILITY:

Post, District, Department Commanders, Adjutants and Quartermasters are reminded of the requirements of Sections 216, 416 and 516 of the Manual of Procedure with regard to proof of eligibility for all newly-elected and appointed officers. Elected and appointed officers **shall not be installed** or assume the duties of their office until proof of eligibility has been submitted and properly reviewed. Failure or refusal to submit proof of eligibility within thirty (30) days of election or appointment shall result in the office being declared vacant.

#### 27. NEW VOICE OF DEMOCRACY AND PATRIOT'S PEN THEMES:

The 2022-23 themes have been chosen by Senior Vice Commander-in-Chief Timothy M. Borland. The Voice of Democracy theme will be "Why is the Veteran Important?" and the Patriot's Pen theme will be "My Pledge to our Veterans."

#### 28. VIETNAM WAR COMMEMORATION:

Posts continue should continue to seek out and present the Commemorative pin to Vietnam veterans wherever they can be found. The upcoming Memorial Day Holiday and associated Poppy Drives should prove fertile ground for this effort. Don't forget to ask for some pins if you need a few while becoming a Commemorative Partner is the best way to ensure you have everything you need.

There were 261 Medals of Honor awarded for actions during the Vietnam War. Records show that nine Virginia natives are included in that total. I have written them all up in the past months, so I am going to pick and choose from among the others trying to cover all branches of service. This month, I will highlight a member of the United States Navy who earned the Congressional Medal of Honor during the Vietnam War.

Robert R. Ingram was born in Clearwater Florida in January 1945 and joined the US Navy in 1963. He completed Corpsman School in San Diego and Field Medical Service School at Camp Pendleton. He was assigned to C Company, 1<sup>st</sup> Bn, 7<sup>th</sup> Marines on Okinawa as a Hospital Corpsman 3<sup>rd</sup> Class when his unit was transferred to Vietnam in July 1965. He earned the Silver Star for gallantry several weeks before the action for which he would ultimately be awarded the Medal of Honor took place. His Medal of Honor citation reads as follows:

For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty while serving as Corpsman with Company C, First Battalion, Seventh Marines against elements of a North Vietnam Aggressor (NVA) battalion in Quang Ngai Province Republic of Vietnam on 28 March 1966. Petty Officer Ingram accompanied the point platoon as it aggressively dispatched an outpost of an NVA battalion. The momentum of the attack rolled off a ridge line down a tree covered slope to a small paddy and a village beyond. Suddenly, the village tree line exploded with an intense hail of automatic rifle fire from approximately 100 North Vietnamese regulars. In mere moments, the platoon ranks were decimated. Oblivious to the danger, Petty Officer Ingram crawled across the bullet spattered terrain to reach a downed Marine. As he administered aid, a bullet went through the palm of his hand. Calls for "CORPSMAN" echoed across the ridge. Bleeding, he edged across the fire swept landscape, collecting ammunition from the dead and administering aid to the wounded. Receiving two more wounds before

realizing the third wound was life-threatening, he looked for a way off the face of the ridge, but again he heard the call for corpsman and again, he resolutely answered. Though severely wounded three times, he rendered aid to those incapable until he finally reached the right flank of the platoon. While dressing the head wound of another corpsman, he sustained his fourth bullet wound. From sixteen hundred hours until just prior to sunset, Petty Officer Ingram pushed, pulled, cajoled, and doctored his Marines. Enduring the pain from his many wounds and disregarding the probability of his demise, Petty Officer Ingram's intrepid actions saved many lives that day. By his indomitable fighting spirit, daring initiative, and unfaltering dedications to duty, Petty Officer Ingram reflected great credit upon himself and upheld the highest traditions of the United States Naval Service.

Ingram survived the battle and his Medal of Honor was presented to him by President <u>Bill Clinton</u> on July 10, 1998 during a ceremony in the White House. In attendance were twenty-four of the men he served with in Vietnam. The delay in the award, made more than thirty years after the battle, was attributed to lost paperwork. He currently resides in Coral Gables, Florida.






