1. COMMANDER'S MESSAGE:

Comrades and Auxiliary,

Greetings. September was another, very busy month across the VFW. I was honored to represent the Virginia VFW at numerous events such as: Warrenton Recruiting Day at Tractor Supply; VFW at the Ballpark-Norfolk Tides Baseball Game; District 8 Recruiting Day-Culpeper; Valley Veterans Ride For Heroes, Waynesboro; and the Fall Council of Administration, Staunton. At the time of this writing, we are packing up to participate at the Virginia State Fair-VFW Recruiting Booth. We will be operating in the Farm Bureau Center-Exhibit Hall from September 23 until October 2. If you are at the Fair, stop by and visit with us.

As part of our effort to offer continuous process improvement, we have conducted extensive training to better enable our officers and members.

School of Instruction: Your State Officers and District Commanders were very busy last month conducting Schools of Instruction all across the state. Thus far, we have conducted twelve of thirteen "District SOIs" with only one remaining. The re-vamped training has been very well received, and I am anticipating great returns on our training.

Recruiting School of Instruction (RSOI): We have completed three regional in-person RSOIs and one virtual (online) RSOI. The training has reached three-quarters of the Posts across the state. Thanks to Instructors Tom Hines and Ken Wiseman.

State Adjutant-Quartermaster (**AQ**) **Training.** State AQ Ed Mann conducted two in-person AQ Training events last month, with in-person and online participation. If your Post or District needs some expert State A/Q Training please contact State Headquarters.

Reporting: Last month, the Department of Virginia achieved 100 percent reporting, for the first half of the year. Thanks to all the individuals, Posts and Districts who made this happen. As a reminder: *All Posts must have submitted the following reports (Hospital, Americanism, Community, Safety and Youth) at least once during the first half of the year (May 1 thru Oct. 31) and once during the second half (Nov. 1 thru Apr. 30).*

Membership: Our membership currently stands at just over 83 percent. Our summer recruiting efforts seem to have paid off. I encourage you to keep pressing with recruiting and retention efforts. Veterans Day/Weekend is a great time to set up a Poppy Drive and recruit some new members. Special thanks to Membership Chair Tom Hines and his outstanding Membership Team for their efforts. If you need a "recruiting assist" just let us know.

Homecoming: It was announced last month that the State Commander & State President's Homecoming will be held on January 13, 2023 at the Renaissance Portsmouth Hotel (see flyer). Over sixty people signed up in the first month. We are anticipating over 150 guests. Let's make this the largest Homecoming ever! The State Homecoming is a free event funded through the sale of State Commander/President shirts and fundraising raffles. We hope all our members and Auxiliary and will attend. RSVP by January 6; you don't want to miss it!

Fund Raising: 2023 VFW State Calendars are on sale now! Initial reception (first month sales) has been very strong. 2023 Calendars are only \$20 each and each calendar provides the holder a chance at one of **365 prizes totaling \$25,000**. Specifically, there will be three \$1000 drawings; seven \$500 drawings; two \$200 drawings; nine \$100 drawings; and 344 \$50 drawings.

Commander & 100th Anniversary (red & gold) shirts are in stock in all sizes, and red ballcaps are on hand. Wear yours to all VFW events, Centennial Celebrations and RED (Remember Everyone Deployed) Shirt Fridays. All proceeds go towards supporting the Homecoming (a free event). Have a great month and make a difference for veterans!

2. ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP:

The National Bylaws provide for only one type of membership: active membership. There are no provisions in the National Bylaws, nor is there any authority or justification for issuance of Club Membership cards, Associate Member cards, Honorary Membership cards, Courtesy Membership cards or any other special type of cards. Any Post issuing such unauthorized cards, or conducting club operations open to the general public, endangers its standing with the Internal Revenue Service as a non-profit organization. Officers signing outlaw cards admitting non-members to VFW premises are subject to disciplinary action. National and Department officers cannot defend practices that conflict with VFW Bylaws or procedures.

3. AUDITS:

Attention of Post Commanders is directed to Section 218(a)(11) of the National Manual of Procedure, Officers: Duties and Obligations. Trustees' Report of Audit must be prepared in detail within thirty (30) days from the end of each quarter. June 30 quarter has ended and is **NOW PAST DUE**.

4. BUDDY POPPY:

Although we emphasize Buddy Poppies on Veterans Day and Memorial Day, it is important to realize that the distribution of Buddy Poppies should be a year-round exercise. Each time a Post participates in an activity where the public will be present, Buddy Poppies should be present as a fundraising tool and simply to recognize our fallen comrades. Where the VFW appears, Buddy Poppies should be a constant reminder that we will never forget

those who have perished in the name of liberty. Just as "They Gave, Will You?" is a year-round thing, so should the distribution of VFW Buddy Poppies.

Remember that your poppies should be ordered a minimum of 8 weeks in advance of your distribution date. Be sure to specify a date by which the poppies are required, do not use "ASAP." We now have Buddy Poppies in stock. Boxes of 500 Buddy Poppies will have to be re-boxed and make take a few days longer to process.

Miscellaneous items (coin cans, buttons, posters, etc.) should be ordered directly from the VFW Store at vfwstore.org/category/programs/buddypoppy or the VFW Store/Emblem and Supply Catalog.

The Manual of Procedure provides that Post relief funds may be used for programs such as Voice of Democracy, Patriot's Pen, Citizenship Education, and Community Service as long as suggestions in the chairmen guidebooks are used as an example of promoting these programs.

Posts are further reminded that Section 711 of the Manual of Procedure provides that non-profit organizations, exempt from taxes under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code, may assist with the distribution of Buddy Poppies, provided there shall be no division of proceeds. A donation to these groups may be made from the Post general fund.

VFW SILVER, GOLD AND DIAMOND ANNIVERSARY POPPIES. The silver, gold and diamond anniversary Buddy Poppies are for Posts that are currently in their 25th, 50th or 75th anniversary years. For Posts currently in their 100th year anniversary, they can order any color and as many as they need. The anniversary poppies are approximately three times as expensive for us to produce, but because of the small quantities we deal in, we don't pass those costs on to the Posts. Please limit your order of anniversary poppies to 1,000 to ensure stock does not run out, unless you are currently in your 100th year. These are ordered through the Department and processed the same as the red poppies. Annotate on the order to National that it is for anniversary poppies and specify which one.

PURCHASING BUDDY POPPIES:

For many years, the courtesy of allowing Posts to buy Poppies and to pay later was something that was extended as a way to help Posts. However, we have started to see too many Posts still owe for Poppies at the end of the year because of not paying their bill. Effective May 30, 2019, Posts must pay before they can receive Poppies. We will continue to accept payment by check, or you can call and order over the phone with State Headquarters by using a credit or debit card. An order form can be found on the State website under Resources, then Forms.

The 2023 revised edition reflects the amendments adopted by the 123rd National Convention, which becomes effective on August 20, 2022.

7. CONTROLL OF UNITS:

All Commanders are reminded that Section 709, Manual of Procedure - Control of Units, requires that any activity, clubroom, holding company or unit sponsored, conducted or operated by, for or in behalf of a Post, County Council, District or Department shall be at all times under the direct control of such Post, County Council, District or Department and that all money, property or assets of any kind or nature, must be placed in the care and custody of the respective Quartermaster. All Commanders should ensure that all provisions of Section 709 are enforced.

14. INCORPORATION:

The attention of the Post Commander is directed to section 708 of the National By-Laws and the Manual of Procedure, which prescribes the procedure for the Incorporation of Units. It shall be the responsibility of the Post Commander to ensure full compliance with both sections and to ensure that all state requirements for annual filing, fees, etc., are met in a timely manner.

Posts should take the necessary steps to incorporate under the laws of the state in which the Post is located. Financial responsibility laws, as interpreted by the courts, may cause members of unincorporated Posts to be at risk. Incorporating under the provisions of section 708 of the National By-Laws and the Manual of Procedure and the laws of the state will provide protection for Post members. Posts are urged to contact their Department Adjutant to obtain the proper forms for incorporating. The Articles of Incorporation must be reviewed by the Commander-in-Chief prior to forwarding them to the proper state authorities.

It is now a requirement by the IRS that all Posts submit this form. This form must be submitted anytime the Post Quartermaster changes and/or the Post address changes. This is effective January 1, 2014.

17. JLC REPORT:

The JLC met at the Virginia War Memorial in Richmond on September 15, 2022. Rick Raskin (Primary) and Joanne Smith (Alternate) represented the VFW.

DVS Commissioner Dan Gade addressed the council and stated that the State of Idaho had been able to acquire a list of VA recipients from TransUnion at about 10¢ per record. He expects that the DVS will also be able to do so and that will help in their targeted outreach program.

He also expects the DVS will be hit with a flood of claims after the passage of the PAC act and is considering options for bringing on additional Veterans Service Representatives.

In a report from MG Tim Williams (National Guard) he stated that the over 3,000 Guard members who were deployed in recent mobilizations should be returning by January 2023. He thanked the JLC for their legislative efforts which have been a major influence in recruitment and retention.

MG Williams also commented that a new beer brand "Ever Forward" would become available in October. A portion of the sales would go to aid NG centric charities.

The JLC approved six legislative initiatives for the next legislative session, three of which were prioritized. The remaining will be prioritized at the next JLC meeting on December 15.

27. VVF COMMUNITY SERVICE GRANT:

The Virginia Veterans Foundation, the official foundation of the Virginia VFW, has opened the window to apply for a grant to perform community service. The grant, funded by Powerhouse Gaming, will provide twelve (12) grants worth up to \$250 for the 2022-2023 year. Should any money remain after the twelve (12) grants are paid out, those not selected in the first round of grants will be considered a second time. The requirements and application are in the attachments. While the project can be completed anytime between July 1, 2022, and June 30, 2023, the application is due no later than November 30, 2022. Posts **AND** Auxiliaries can apply for this grant, but only one

grant will be given to an individual Post or their Auxiliary, regardless of who applies. Entries can be mailed, faxed, or emailed to State Headquarters.

28. VVF POST HOME IMPROVEMENT AND ASSISTANCE GRANT:

Recently, the Board of Directors for the Virginia Veterans Foundation approved a reduction in the Foundation's budget affecting several items. An affected item is the Post Home Improvement Grant. There are still 10 grants available, but each will be for a maximum of \$300. The application is attached and on the state's website. The deadline and other requirements for the program are the same.

The Foundation's Board felt this change was necessary to plan for future years where less revenue is possible while still trying to maintain the programs supported by the Foundation. We hope everyone can understand and support this and we will continue to monitor our budget to find opportunities to support our organization.

Entries can be mailed, faxed, or emailed to State Headquarters.

29. VIETNAM WAR COMMEMORATION:

It's not too late for Posts or Districts to become commemorative partners in the Vietnam War 50th Anniversary Commission. Visit https://www.vietnamwar50th.com/ and take it from there.

This month's Vietnam War Congressional Medal of Honor winner is Merlyn H. Detheifsen. Born in Greenville IA in 1934, he joined the Air Force in 1954 and was commissioned via the Aviation Cadet program the following year. Dethlefsen served as a Navigator on C-124 Globemaster transports at Dover Air Force Base from February 1957 to January 1959, and then entered Undergraduate Pilot Training at Bainbridge Air Force Base. After receiving his pilot wings in February 1960 and attending combat crew training, Dethlefsen flew F-100 Super Sabres with the 9th Tactical Fighter Squadron at Spangdahlem Air Base from January 1961 to February 1965. He flew with the 560th Tactical Fighter Squadron at McConnell Air Force Base from February 1965 to October 1966, when he deployed to Southeast Asia.

Dethlefsen flew F-105 Thunderchief fighters with the <u>333rd Tactical Fighter Squadron</u> and then the <u>354th Tactical Fighter Squadron</u> of <u>335th Tactical Fighter Wing</u> at <u>Takhli Royal Thai Air Force Base</u> at <u>Thailand</u>, from October 1966 to June 1967. By March 10, 1967, had risen to the rank of <u>captain</u>. On that day, his actions in the air earned him the Medal of Honor. His citation reads as follows:

Major (then Captain) Dethlefsen was 1 of a <u>flight</u> of <u>F-105</u> aircraft engaged in a fire suppression mission designed to destroy a key antiaircraft defensive complex containing <u>surface-to-air missiles</u> (SAM), an exceptionally heavy concentration of antiaircraft artillery, and other automatic weapons. The defensive network was situated to dominate the approach and provide protection to an important North Vietnamese industrial center that was scheduled to be attacked by <u>fighter bombers</u> immediately after the strike by Maj. Dethlefsen's flight. In the initial attack on the defensive complex the lead aircraft was crippled, and Maj. Dethlefsen's aircraft was extensively damaged by the intense enemy fire. Realizing that the success of the impending fighter bomber attack on the center now depended on his ability to effectively suppress the defensive fire, Maj. Dethlefsen ignored the enemy's overwhelming firepower and the damage to his aircraft and pressed his attack. Despite a continuing hail of antiaircraft fire, deadly surface-to-air missiles, and counterattacks by <u>MIG</u> interceptors, Maj. Dethlefsen flew repeated close range strikes to silence the enemy defensive positions with bombs and cannon fire. His action in rendering ineffective the defensive SAM and antiaircraft artillery sites enabled the ensuing fighter bombers to strike successfully the important industrial target without loss or damage to their aircraft, thereby appreciably reducing

the enemy's ability to provide essential war material. Maj. Dethlefsen's consummate skill and selfless dedication to this significant mission were in keeping with the highest traditions of the U.S. Air Force and reflect great credit upon himself and the Armed Forces of his country

Dethlefsen could have pulled out of the mission on a number of occasions: when attacked by MiGs, when he and his wingman were hit by flak, or when the smoke of battle made it difficult to locate the enemy. But he decided to make repeated passes, each one more dangerous than the one before. For his actions, Dethlefsen was awarded the Medal of Honor by President Lyndon B. Johnson on February 1, 1968. He became the third of 12 airmen so honored during the Vietnam War. He retired from the Air Force in 1977 with the rank of colonel. Dethlefsen died at age 53 of natural causes on December 14, 1987, and was subsequently buried in Section 65 of Arlington National Cemetery.

Written and recorded audio essays are submitted by each applicant and address an annual patriotic theme. The 2022 theme is, "Why is the Veteran Important?" The contest is open to students in grades 9-12. More specific information, including rules, forms, and brochures are available at http: www.vfw.org.

In order to have a successful program this year it is important that participating Posts begin recruiting high schools, teachers and students as soon as possible. Since high schools in your area have already let out for summer vacation, you can either contact them now electronically through emails and social media or contact them directly as soon as classes resume.

Laurie K. Clay was selected to her current position as Department Service Officer (DSO) in August 2022. As the DSO for the VFW Department of Virginia, she is responsible for ensuring all Virginia Veterans receive the best possible service from both the Department of Virginia Service Officers and the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA).



Laurie began her 21-year career with the Department of Veterans Affairs as a Veterans Service Representative (VSR) in August 1998 and was promoted to Rating Veterans Service Representative (RVSR) in 2002, Coach in 2005, Assistant Service Center Manager (VSCM) in 2007 and VSCM in 2009. Laurie's favorite position was when she served as a Rating Quality Review Specialist from 2012 to retirement in 2019. In this position, she felt she had the most impact on Veteran's rating decisions by mentoring rating and appeal team employees.

Subject: Citizenship Education Teacher Recognition

There is a change for the 2022-2023 Program. Once again, National will recognize teachers from elementary, middle and high school rather than the State selecting one of their winners and submitting that entry. Our State's 3 winners will all receive recognition from National.

Post and District Chairpersons are strongly encouraged to go to the National website (http:www.vfw.org) and download the VFW National Citizenship Education Teacher Award Chairman's Manual. This document contained entry forms, judging sheets and the necessary information that you need to run a successful program.

Post chairmen must be sure to send the original entry form for the winners along with a one-page resume as a minimum, or up to five pages (both sides) as a maximum of documentation of their teaching experience, such as references, news articles, etc. Also, good quality head and shoulders photograph from the winning teachers.

<u>Eligibility</u>: Teachers who promote civic responsibility, flag etiquette and patriotism are prime candidates for this award. For example, do you know a teacher who plans field trips to city hall or organizes community volunteer projects? Maybe you know an instructor who invites veterans into the classroom to discuss their military experiences. Perhaps you are familiar with a teacher who fosters the development of democratic value and beliefs through special projects. If you know of such a teacher, honor him or her today.

All current certified/licensed teachers in grades K-12 are eligible. Previous national winners are ineligible. Nominations can be submitted by themselves, fellow teachers, supervisors, family members or other interested individuals, including students.

15 November 22: Post Judging complete
10 December 22: District Judging complete

17 December 22: District winners must be at State Chairman for judiging

19 December 22: State Judging

<u>Post Chairpersons</u>: Don't forget to fill out the bottom portion of the entry form showing number of teachers participating; number of winners advanced to District; amount of Post/Auxiliary awards; and, amount of Post/Auxiliary additional expenses.

<u>District Chairpersons</u>: You will have a report to submit with your entries to State that reflect Post information as well as District awards and expense money. This report will be emailed/mailed to you by November 1 and should be submitted with your District winners.

VFW Community Service Grant

The purpose of the VFW Community Service Grant is to assist VFW Posts and Auxiliaries in Virginia who need assistance with funding community service projects. There will be of twelve (12) grants worth up to \$250 each for the 2022-2023 year. All requirements must be met, or the grant must be returned, in part or in whole, depending on the circumstances.

The requirements of the grant are as follows:

- 1) The project must be initiated and completed in the period of July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023.
- 2) The VFW Post or Auxiliary in question must have a current non-profit status on file with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and the Post must provide the IRS paperwork proving this.
- 3) The Post or Auxiliary must be in good standing with the VFW National Headquarters and the Department of Virginia.
- 4) If the project is hosted at a building, it must be a non-smoking building regardless of the owner's rules for the use of the building.
- 5) The grant is not to be used for work on a VFW Post home or the property owned by any membership-based organization.
- 6) Receipts for the project must be provided and payment of the grant will not occur until this is done with all payments coming after project completion.
- 7) Should the project costs total less than \$250 once completed, the balance of the grant will not be paid. Additional projects may not be added to an approved grant. Alterations to an approved grant require approval by the Virginia Veterans Foundation before the grant can be claimed.
- 8) The VFW Post or Auxiliary receiving the grant must agree to allow the VFW Department of Virginia and Virginia Veterans Foundation the opportunity to promote the project on social media, in official communications, and in other forms of marketing.
- 9) The grant will only cover materials and the Post is responsible for providing labor. This can be done through paying for labor or by doing the work themselves.
- 10) All decisions on grants are final and will be made by the Board of Directors for the Virginia Veterans Foundation.
- 11) Funding from this grant program may be combined with other grants but the total of the funding received cannot exceed actual costs and the amount received from this grant may be reduced accordingly.
- 12) Only one grant per year will be provided to an individual Post or Auxiliary, regardless of who applies for the grant.

VFW Post Home Improvement and Assistance Grant

The purpose of the VFW Post Home Improvement bs Assistance Grant is to assist VFW Posts in Virginia who need assistance with funding projects to improve, expand, or repair their Post home as well as assisting those Posts in financial need. There will be ten (10) grants worth up to \$300 each for the 2022-2023 year. All requirements must be met or the Post will be required to return the grant, in part or in whole, depending on the circumstances.

The requirements of the grant are as follows:

- 1) If funding a project, it must be initiated and completed in the period of July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023. Post must submit a thorough justification for the grant.
- 2) If asking for emergency assistance, the Post must explain the reason for the emergency and provide a plan for how the Post will raise money in the future and prepare for future problems.
- 3) The VFW Post in question must have a current non-profit status on file with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and must provide the IRS paperwork proving this.
- 4) The Post must be in good standing with the VFW National and Department Headquarters.
- 5) If funding a project, the Post must own or lease the Post and must provide a copy of the documents showing either ownership or a current lease. For Posts who lease the property, there must be at least 2 years remaining on the lease to receive a grant.
- 6) The Post must not allow smoking in their Post building but may use the grant to repair damage after voting to ban smoking. A ban on smoking is defined as no smoking allowed inside the building of the Post home. It may be allowed outside of the building.
- 7) Receipts for the project or bills covered by the assistance requested must be provided and payment of the grant will not occur until this is done with all payments coming after project completion or for bills already paid.
- 8) Should the project costs or assistance requested total less than \$300 once complete, the balance of the grant will not be paid. Additional projects may not be added to an approved grant. Alterations to an approved grant require approval by the Virginia Veterans Foundation before the grant can be claimed.
- 9) The VFW Post receiving the grant must agree to allow the VFW Department of Virginia and Virginia Veterans Foundation the opportunity to promote the funded project on social media, in official communications, and in other forms of marketing.
- 10) The grant will only cover materials and the Post is responsible for providing labor. This can be done through paying for labor or by doing the work themselves.
- 11) All decisions on grants are final and will be made by the Board of Directors for the Virginia Veterans Foundation.


