Korean War Sailor Visits Navy's Newest Ship

Retired Master Chief Petty Officer Gus Villalobos of Victoria, now 91 years young, participated in a time-honored Navy tradition when he helped 'pin' Chief's Anchors on his grandson-in-law, Nick Swartz, who was just promoted in ceremonies on the nuclear powered USS JOHN F. KENNEDY (CVN-79). Both men are members of Victoria VFW Post 9954.

From Korea to Now

Villalobos enlisted in the Navy at 18 and became a Radioman serving in the Korean War earning a Combat Action Ribbon when his ship was hit Communist shore batteries. He crosstrained to be a Cryptologic Technician listening in on Soviet

secrets during the Cold War. On returning to Victoria, he became active in the Veterans of Foreign Wars where he served as the Fourth District Commander earning the rare 'All-American' status.

Villalobos said the September 27 ceremony gave him a rare opportunity to see one of the Navy's newest nuclear powered air-



craft carriers which is still "fitting out" with its commissioning crew. It is finalizing some additional work and is scheduled for delivery to the Navy sometime in 2025. The nuclear-energy will allow it to cruise for 20 to 25 years with its 90 aircraft and 4660-man crew allowing the United States to project power anywhere in the world at any time.

Villalobos was impressed with the ship and ceremony and noted, "It was a wonderful day for all parties involved!"
